Educational systems across the world are changing, and eLearning is one critical factor. How will this revolution affect your classes? As an English teacher in Austria, how can you use eLearning to your advantage? Read more to learn how you can get free access to an eLearning platform especially developed for teachers of English and their students.

## eLearning in Practice

Possibly your educational institution uses Moodle or has a language lab with CD-ROMs. Possibly you have heard of acronyms such as: EPSS (Electronic Performance Support Systems), CBT (Computer-Based Training), IBT (InternetBased Training) or WBT (Web-Based Training).

## All of these are examples of eLearning.

eLearning is a very large "umbrella" category that includes instructional content provided via Internet, local area network (LAN) or CD-ROM/DVD. While these new learning options do not replace teachers, they do provide revolutionary opportunities.

For example, iTunesU enables students as well as the general public to have access to speeches, interviews, faculty presentations and other educational material produced by universities. MIT, Stanford and Duke University are just a few of the leading educational institutions with iTunesU programs.

Technology is being infused into the classroom (and into the boardroom) in countless ways; as a result, students of all ages and backgrounds are now rarely satisfied by simply memorizing the same content that other students memorized decades ago. They want fresh material, personalization, custom feedback and an entertaining learning approach.

Clearly, our role as teachers is changing as technology takes hold in daily life. We are often faced with multitasking
students running off to SMS or write emails during the breaks. We are asked for specialized vocabulary and extra resources for use outside of class, and we are expected to provide measurable results - quickly.

## An eLearning Solution for Austrian Teachers

The "digital classroom" revolution poses an interesting question: What kind of eLearning resource best supports English teachers? The resource should cover general English topics (such as grammar, reading and listening) but also have a strong Business English component. Given the diversity of our students, it would be helpful if the resource provided some cross-cultural training as well.

Considering all of these factors, the best resource is an eLearning platform (website) which teachers and students can access via passwords - anytime and anywhere. No need for language labs, technical support personnel or special infrastructure. The website should have new and relevant material added each month, and be responsive to the requests of its subscribers.

The ideal website would also provide special support for teachers. It would be an ongoing source of personal training for the teacher outside of the classroom, as well as a clear support for the teacher inside the classroom. It would eliminate the days of teachers standing beside copy machines printing homework assignments and it would enable teachers to have access to a wide range of specialized business vocabulary, already translated into various languages.
